

# Meet the workers in Indonesia who help produce Phillips seafood



Phillips is proud to be 'anchored in Maryland', but increasingly relies on Asia for its crabmeat, particularly for Phillips products sold in supermarkets. The company says it's 'committed to fishing communities around the world'. Workers at the Phillips seafood factory in Lampung, Indonesia, want Phillips to back up that claim. Most of the 600 production

workers at the factory are women. Half of them have no permanent jobs. They don't know from one day to the next if they'll have work. There are no benefits and the work is tough. For over two years the workers at the Lampung factory has been asking for permanent jobs for 100 workers who have worked there continuously for up to 15 years.

Management is telling these workers that only the US owners can make that decision. In June, a US Phillips manager briefly visited the factory, but left without talking to the workers. The workers are still waiting. Please take a moment to think about the Phillips workers who produce crabmeat for the US market and are asking for decent work.
